Matthew 25:14-30

1. What is something valuable you were given as a child that you still have to this day? Where do you keep it?

2. How has God demonstrated His faithfulness to you recently?

3. Read Matthew 25:14-30 and review the points of the outline. What part of the message would you like to discuss further with your group.

4. In the message, faithfulness was defined as both being trustworthy as well as being full of faith. How do those two aspects go together?

5. From the Parable of the Bags of Gold (Matthew 25:14-30), why do you think each person is given different amounts?

6. Contrast Jesus' words to the first two men (vss. 21, 23) with His words to the third guy (vss. 26-30). What is the opposite of faithful according to vs. 26? What else do you notice?

7. Which faithfulness blocker are you most prone to? Why?

8. When you think about all that God has entrusted you (spiritually, relationally, physically, intellectually, financially), what stands out? How could you better use that for His glory?

9. Where have you seen answered prayer as a group this session? Take some time to celebrate God's faithfulness in these areas. Share any current prayer requests.
