- 1. Do you have a seat at the dinner table where you always sit? How about others that you live with? Do you have a chair that is "your chair" in your home? How do you feel when someone sits there?
- 2. In Jesus' day, people equated leadership with greatness. Not much has changed. Give some examples of how our culture elevates leaders. Is it fair to equate leadership and greatness, or not?
- 3. Read Luke 22:24-30 and review the message outline. What stood out from the message for you?
- 4. Can you even believe the disciples? Bickering over who is the greatest among them on the night of the Last Supper. What do you think prompted the argument? Why did this seem important to them right then?
- 5. Our culture often tells kids that they should aspire to be leaders. Jesus' message was that we should aspire to be servants. How does that sit with you?
- 6. Which of the misconceptions from the outline do you struggle with the most? Do you feel helped or challenged by the corresponding truth?
- 7. When have you felt rewarded from serving God? Was human applause important in that, or was God's reward enough?
- 8. Where has God given you leadership or opportunities for influence? How will you apply this message in that arena? And where would you like to step out in service this week? Be specific.
