Judges 3:12-4:1 | September 19, 2021

1. What handed are you? Any left-handers in your family members? What are advantages and/or disadvantages?
2. Have you ever had a *I didn't know THAT was in the Bible* moment? What was it? How have you dealt with it (*researched it, laughed it off, ignored it, got stuck in your faith because of it, other*)?
3. How should believers deal with uncomfortable, troubling, and confusing parts of the Bible?
4. This week we began a new series. Read Judges 3:12-4:1 and review the outline. What points stood out to you?
5. Review the pattern of redemption at the beginning of the outline. Do you think this has to be repeated in every generation of believers?
6. What was the significance of Ehud being left-handed?
7. Picture the story of Ehud being passed on to kids and grandkids in the camps of Israel. What reaction would it create? What underlying messages might there be?
8. What is the good news in this story? What is the tragedy?
9. How can your group pray for you? Take some time to pray for one another.
