## HomeGroup Questions

Winter Session 2022 Doom, Gloom ... or Bloom? | What Would Jesus UNdo? Luke 21:5-36 | March 27, 2022

- In life, are you more of a Doom & Gloom person ... or Bloom person (pessimist or optimist)? If you're married, what would you say your spouse is?
- 2. Read Luke 20:5-36 and review the outline. What would it be like for the disciples to hear from Jesus that their beloved Temple was going to be destroyed?
- 3. Look again at vss. 5-9. What do you think the disciples were prone to be deceived about?
- 4. Jesus goes back and forth in this section between talking about Jerusalem's soon destruction (70 AD) and the historical events leading to His Return. See if you can tell which belongs to which.
- 5. Mark Twain said, "History doesn't repeat itself, but it rhymes." What similarity do you think there is between the destruction of the Temple Jesus predicted in vs. 6 (which happened exactly as Jesus predicted in 70 AD) and the conflict at the end of the world?
- 6. Have you ever been taught, or believed, that Jesus was going to return in the past and it didn't happen? How about someone you know? If so, what did you learn from it?
- 7. Look at vss. 29-30. What is the difference between focusing on the day of Jesus' return vs. focusing on the season of His return?
- 8. What are the heart-dangers Jesus addresses in vs. 34? How would these keep people from experiencing God in their life?
- 9. How can your group pray for you this week?
