

- 2. Did you write anything on the 1970s God's Faithfulness poster in the lobby? If so, what?
- 3. Had you heard any of the songs from the worship medley at the beginning of the message?
- 4. Read Matthew 6:31-34 and review the message. What stood out for you?
- 5. Jesus instructed us not to worry. But He did not expect us to treat the things we worry about as unimportant. Instead, He said that we can release our worries because God already knows what we need (vs. 32). How should that impact your prayers? How could that change your worries?
- 6. Look at vs. 33. What does it practically look like to make God's Kingdom your priority? Give some real life examples.
- 7. God's righteousness covers both being right with God and with the people in our lives. Which is harder? How could you make that a priority this week?
- 8. Doug talked about God's "abundant supply" in our lives. Does God only provide our real needs? Or more than that? Where have you seen God's faithfulness to you in meeting your needs?
- 9. How can your group pray for you?
