


"God Won't Give You More Than You Can Handle"

WHAT THIS POPULAR ADVICE SAYS	WHAT JESUS ACTUALLY SAID

- 1. Has anyone ever advised you with the phrase, "God Won't Give You More Than You Can Handle/Bear"? Was it helpful or not? Before this message, what was your take on the expression?
- 2. Read John 16:12-33 and 1 Cor. 10:13 and review the outline. What challenged you and/or comforted you? Why?
- 3. What about the way this expression ("God Won't Give You More Than You Can Handle") is not helpful advice to someone going through troubles? See the first column in your outline.
- 4. Read 1 Corinthians 10:13. If this does not mean, "God Won't Give You More Than You Can Handle," what does it mean? Rephrase it in your own words.
- 5. In John 16:33 Jesus says He is telling the disciples what He does so they might have peace. Yet, in the next sentence, He says they will have trouble. Can you have both at the same time? Have you experienced this?
- 6. While some trouble we clearly bring on ourselves, Doug said that much of the trouble we experience is because we live in a broken world that brings it arbitrarily. What might be an example of this?
- 7. Instead of having to handle troubles ourselves, Jesus invites us to hand them over to Him (see the last part of vs. 33). But this is easier said than done. How do we put this into practice?
- 8. Take the common phrase, "God Won't Give You More Than You Can Handle," and rewrite it so that it is consistent with Jesus' teaching in this passage.
