- 4. Read John 4:4-35 and review the outline. What would you like to explore further?
- 5. The woman at the well was quite comfortable asking Jesus questions? Why? Was she curious? Astonished? Doubtful? Changing the topic? Other?
- 6. Jesus always answers the woman's questions. Sometimes He answered directly. Sometimes He took the conversation in a different direction? Why?
- 7. Doug suggested that, for some people, when they have been Christians for a while, they stop asking Jesus questions. Have you ever experienced this? Why might that be?
- 8. What are the benefits of being honest and open with God about our questions and doubts? Name several. Have you ever experienced this?
- 9. How can your group pray for you?
