- 3. Older translations of verse 7 refer to the recipients of Paul's letter as "saints," while newer versions use "God's holy people." What does each phrase convey? Which do you prefer?
- 4. You are loved by God and belong to Him (Romans 1:6-7; Jude 1:1). How does knowing that God loves you and won't let you go shape your daily life and decisions? In what ways does this truth offer comfort in difficult times?
- 5. Paul calls us to be "holy" and "set apart" (Romans 1:1, 5-7). Doug said, "Being set apart from culture doesn't mean we're supposed to be weird, or awkward." What does it mean then?
- 6. How does understanding that all believers are saints help relieve the pressure to "be good enough" while encouraging us to live as God intends?
- 7. How does being part of a larger community of faith impact your spiritual growth? In what ways can we strengthen our connections with fellow believers? Believers from the past? Believers around the world? Believers at Green Valley Church?
- 8. How has your view of being a "saint" changed because of this message?
