

- 1. Can you share a time, in our fast-paced, digital world, when you felt "anonymous" like you were just another person in the crowd?
- 2. Read Psalm 139:1-6. How does it make you feel knowing that God knows every detail of your activities, thoughts, and words—even before they happen?
- 3. If God knows our thoughts so well, why do you think people sometimes struggle to be honest with Him in prayer? How should the truth of God's intimate knowledge of our lives impact our prayers?
- 4. Have you ever experienced a moment when you felt like a message at church or a word of encouragement was "just for you"? How does that reflect God's intimate knowledge of us?
- 5. Given that God already knows everything about us, why do you think David asks God to "search" him in Psalm 139:23? What is the purpose of this prayer?
- 6. David's prayer doesn't stop at searching; he also asks God to lead him. How are those two requests connected?
- 7. Reflect on one specific area where you need God to "search" you or "lead" you this week.
- 8. As we wrap up our HomeGroups for the Fall, where have you seen God at work in your group this session? Any God sightings? Answered prayer? Significant insights? How can your group support you in prayer over the holiday season?
